Government policy

- ...- 1995 no policy in relation to integration or citizenship
- 1998 Law on integration of Newcomers:
 - Responsibility of the Dutch society
 - Obligatory lessons of Dutch and knowledge of Dutch society
 - No exams but certificates.
- 2006 Law on integration:
 - Own responsibility of the migrant
 - Social Integration exam in home country
 - Social Integration exam in the NL



Requirements for Language Test and Culture test

- Make a test of spoken Dutch and Knowledge of Dutch Society that:
 - Can be taken at any time, any place
 - Can be taken without written materials
 - Can be administered by embassy staff
 - Has immediate results
 - Is absolutely secure
 - Has results expressed on scale of Council of Europe (language test)
- And of course
 - Reliable, valid and all that jazz

PKT's technical solutions

Tests that measures listening and speaking performance

- In direct interaction
- Using speech recognition & automated scoring

Advantages:

- Spoken, real time
- Directly available on demand anywhere
- No rater dependence and zero rater variance
- Immediate results



What is tested?

Facility in spoken language:

- Ability to track what is said
- Extract meaning in real time
- Formulate responses
- Produce responses at a conversational pace, that are relevant and intelligible






Example: open short answer question

Bill arrived at 12:30 for a meeting at noon. How late was he?




Simplified Response Network





Testing Service Infrastructure






Automated scoring

- No human interference needed
- Independent of time and place
- Automated management reporting tool
- Reliable and consistent
- Efficient → reduced costs
- Secure for loss and fraud



Validation





Validation and reliability of machine scoring of the Language and Culture test

- r= 0.93 between human scores and machine scores of the Language Test
- r= 0.94 between human scores and machine scores of the Culture test



Political - and other impacts

- Criticism; not because of quality but because of political disagreement on immigration law
- Sceptisism because of the innovative aspects of language testing
- Unfamiliarity with the CEF scales
- Competition from academic speech recognition community
- Unfamiliarity with speech recognition and technology



Independent research (TNO) on validation and reliability of automated scoring

- No substantial differences between human scores and machine scores on the Language and Culture test
- Candidates with strong foreign accents are not disadvantaged



Human rejudgement of machine scoring

Human rejudgement procedure:

- 1. Monitoring machine scoring and human scoring for a certain period
- 2. When no scoring is possible for reasons of status 1 (too much noise, no scoring possible)
- 3. Suspicion of fraud



Actual situation

2010:

- Language test: > 30,000 high stakes tests every year
- Culture test: approx.10,000
- In Progress: Literacy and comprehensive reading test
 A1 – CEF scale
